'Why Give' Quote of the Month

“Harvard has always encouraged its alumni and friends to be philanthropic on a broad scale and to support the numerous worthy causes that ask for their help. However, the University hopes that donors will also include Harvard in their philanthropic priorities. Harvard's work involves educating future leaders and finding long-term solutions to problems rather than providing immediate relief from them. For example, many donors had tremendous impact in the late 1940s by giving money to provide iron lungs to polio victims. Those who gave to Harvard supported the research of Professor John Enders, whose work ultimately contributed to the development of the polio vaccine. Similarly, we hope people will provide relief to those individuals and families affected by Hurricane Katrina. At the same time, gifts to endow faculty positions at the Harvard Graduate School of Design might lead to structures designed to better withstand future hurricanes.”
